Laurel Blakemore, MD

Shriners Professorship in Pediatric Orthopaedics

Established in 2019, this gift supports a professor in the UF department of orthopaedics and rehabilitation specializing in pediatric orthopaedics, including clinical care, education and research. Since opening the doors of its first hospital in Shreveport, Louisiana in 1922, Shriners Hospitals for Children has grown into a pediatric specialty health care system with hospitals in the U.S., Canada and Mexico.

Peter Indelicato, M.D., Professorship in Orthopaedic and Sports Medicine

The UF Health Orthopaedics and Sports Medicine Institute established this fund in 2011 to enable educators to pursue projects at the forefront of orthopaedics and sports medicine at the University of Florida in honor of Peter Indelicato, MD. Dr. Indelicato served as a sports medicine physician for members of the Los Angeles Rams, Lakers, Dodgers and Kings and was the associate team physician for the Miami Dolphins. The former chief of sports medicine for the UF Department of Orthopaedics and Rehabilitation, Dr. Indelicato retired as the head team physician for the UF Athletic Association in 2011, a position he held since 1977.

Internationally Renowned Health Policy and Value-Based Care Expert Visits UF Health



Kevin Bozic, MD, MBA visited UF Health as a Visiting Professor and guest of the Arthroplasty division on May 16-17, 2019. He shared his vision for how the delivery of musculoskeletal care, as well as training healthcare leaders for tomorrow, are being transformed in the evolving healthcare world. Dr. Bozic, the inaugural Chairman of the Department of Surgery and Perioperative Services at the University of Texas at Austin, is a world-renowned thought leader on innovative care delivery, particularly in incorporating value-based principles in musculoskeletal health care.

Dr. Bozic's visit kicked off with a spirited discussion in a journal-club format for the residents and fellows on the principles of value-based care,

as well as ways to understand and interpret the medical literature. He then delivered an orthopaedic Grand Rounds on "The Future of Educating Orthopaedic Surgeons in New Healthcare Delivery Models," speaking to the importance of leadership training for orthopaedic surgeons, among other key points.

The next morning, Dr. Bozic delivered an interactive and energetic Surgical Safety Symposium talk to the combined perioperative services groups on the "Lessons Learned in the Transition to Value-Based Care" reflecting on the opportunities and challenges experienced by his group while embracing new health care delivery models. Following that talk, the orthopaedic department had the opportunity to enjoy a roundtable discussion with UFHealth leadership, including senior vice president David R. Nelson, MD, on how health systems can adapt-- particularly with respect to musculoskeletal care--in the new era of value based purchasing of health care and physician services, right-sizing care, and patient-centered personalized medicine.


In his current role, Dr. Bozic has been tasked with building a transformative surgical health system in Austin, the first American top-40 research university to open a medical school in over 40 years. The central tenet that has defined his time at Austin is building "value." This value has been achieved through improving outcomes that are meaningful to patients, while reducing costs, by improving data transparency for care providers and realigning practice and payment models to value high-yield, evidence-based interventions.

Physician leaders from UF, including several members of the department of Orthopaedics, will be visiting Dr. Bozic's Musculoskeletal I nstitute in December to watch these principles in action and understand how these ideas can be translated to innovate care delivery here in Florida.
